<u>ITEM DESCRIPTION:</u> Consider adopting a resolution authorizing the acquisition of seven rights of way, three drainage easements, and one temporary construction easement necessary for the construction of Outer Loop West Project Phase One and authorizing closing costs associated with the purchases in an estimated amount of \$815,000.

BACKGROUND: The City is in the design phase for roadway improvements to Outer Loop West Project Phase One from Jupiter Drive to Riverside Trail. Improvements include a new four lane arterial roadway, improved water utilities, drainage conveyance, pedestrian facilities, striping, signage, landscaping, and erosion control. Currently, the design anticipates needing right of way, temporary construction easements, and drainage easements from thirty-six (36) properties.

Appraisals have been completed and offers have been made to the owners of all properties. No relocation of businesses or citizens is anticipated with is project. With the assistance of Stateside Right of Way Services, the City has reached an agreement with five property owners for rights of way and easements needed for the project. At its August 20, September 3, and September 17 meetings, Council has authorized the acquisition of fourteen rights of way, five drainage easements, and six temporary construction easements from nine owners. Closings for those acquisitions are currently being coordinated.
